This dress with its plastic, lolita skirt and avantgarde, over-the-shoulder milk-gallon-handle corset was designed to show the extreme extent and absurdity of the ocean plastic crisis. It was designed with sailor and oceanic imagery in mind. The entire garment was handmade; the "fabric" was created using newspaper and duct tape and then was used to make a pattern for the skirt and top. The skirt was then covered in recycled, cut gallon milk jugs which gave it its large, signature waves. The waves of rounded plastic present in the skirt help to further illustrate the plastic that fills our world's oceans.
